

Sample Double Major Pathway AAS and Liberal Studies

Minimum Units Required for Graduation: 120 units

With no double/triple counting:

GE	48 units
AAS Major	39 units
<u>Liberal Studies Major</u>	<u>46 units</u>

133 units needed for double major and GE

With double/triple counting from the sample double major pathway in AAS and Liberal Studies (see below):

Notes:

- This AAS Major pathway sample fulfills LLD and all overlay GE requirements that do not have specific unit requirements.
- This sample pathway also does not include other graduation requirements such as GWAR, critical thinking, written English communication, etc. that AAS offers but are not required for the AAS major.
- Liberal Studies courses that fulfill other GE requirements are not factored in this sample pathway. Please consult with Liberal Studies for their list of GE certified courses that double count for their major for possible triple counting of units.

The following sample is based on a possible GE track, with an UD Topical Perspective on Human Diversity.

18 units (highlighted) can double count for GE and AAS major, fulfilling C3, D2, D3, LLD, AERM, ES, GP, SJ, AI, UD Human Diversity. 21 units are actually highlighted because AAS 587 fulfills AERM and ES, but these GE attributes do not have unit requirements, hence the 18-unit count.

3 units (highlighted) can triple count for GE, AAS major, and Liberal Studies major.
